(b) To be selected in consultation with faculty advisor based on student's program of study. You are free to choose any courses at or above 100-level to complete unrestricted electives, although you may need to use some of these credits to take a math course that prepares you for the required level of math in your program. If you begin French at a higher level than FRE\*101/111, you will receive additional unrestricted electives to begin work on completing a minor. Central Connecticut State University (CCSU) will require that you complete a minor by earning at least 18 credits in one area outside your major field; you must complete at least 9 of those minor credits at CCSU. You can also complete other General Education requirements for CCSU, Southern Connecticut State University (SCSU), Western Connecticut State University (WCSU), and Charter Oak State College (COSC) - but not at Eastern Connecticut State University (ECSU).

To graduate and be guaranteed admission to a State University or Charter Oak State College, the student must earn an overall 2.0 grade point average.

**COLLEGE POLICY REQUIRES THAT STUDENTS WHO HAVE COMPLETED SIX CREDITS MUST TAKE THE PLACEMENT TEST IN ENGLISH AND MATHEMATICS AND MEET WITH A STAFF MEMBER TO ENROLL IN A PROGRAM.**

The following quality point averages must be earned by students for academic good standing:

1.50 GPA up to 11 Semester Hours

1.70 GPA completion of 12-30 Semester Hours

2.00 GPA completion of 31-60+ Semester Hours

Students with averages less than those cited may have their achievements reviewed by their advisor. Such a review result in a modified program or other formal action.

## **GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS - DEGREE AND CERTIFICATE STUDENTS**

In order to qualify for graduation, a student must be accepted in a degree or certificate program may and have:

- a. achieved a quality point average of 2.0 or more in the courses required for his/her program.
- b. Achieved a minimum grade of C- in Composition for all degree programs and where indicated for certificates.
- c. Filed a completed application for graduation with the Records Office, by March 1st or November 1st.
- d. Filed with the Records Office a Program Guide signed by both the student and their advisor.
- e. Fulfilled all financial obligations to the College.
- f. Completed at least 25% of the minimum credit requirements for the degree or certificate at Tunxis Community College.

Graduation Honors: Graduation Honors will be awarded during the presentation of graduates. Honors are based on program grade point average. Honors criteria are listed as follows:

AA/AS Degree - 30 credits at Tunxis

3.90 – 4.00 = Highest Honors

3.70 – 3.89 = High Honors

3.40 – 3.69 = Honors

Certificate - 15 credits at Tunxis

3.50 = With Distinction

Note: Credits earned in developmental courses do not satisfy degree or certificate requirements.
